## **LENGTH OF TERM**

Trustees are nominated by the Corewell Health Foundation Board and are elected by the Corewell Health West Board to serve for a three-year term. Trustees may be re-elected. In addition, several trustees are ex-officio members, with voting rights, because of the position they hold. This includes the President of Corewell Health West, the immediate past Presidents of the Blodgett and Butterworth Auxiliaries and the Foundation President. The immediate past Presidents of the Blodgett & Butterworth Auxiliaries serve a two-year term.

## **MEETINGS**

Board meetings are held quarterly. From time-to-time, there are special meetings such as the System Board Summit and Foundation Symposium.
